Upon arriving enter through the door on the right side of the garage to go to the basement. Starting time is 9am. Lunch is bringing your own, go out for lunch and come back or?







## **Member Feedback**

There are several issues that the Board would appreciate your feedback.

**Bylaws:** At our last meeting we discussed a few possible changes to our existing bylaws.

1) Making the Paymaster and the Website Manager appointed positions rather than subject to elections every two years.

Every time there is a change in the Paymaster position we have to change the signatories on our checking account. This would seem to be a rather simple process, but it is far more complicated than it would seem.

Related to our new Website Manager, which is a new position, it seems to make sense for this to also be an appointed position as there is quite a bit of specific technical knowledge that is required to develop and maintain a website.

**Website:** The board is pleased to officially announce that Tony Vacha has agreed to take over the responsibility of developing and maintaining the Division 9's Website. www.ncr-div9.com.

We are working on a plan to move the website to a more permanent host and taking a fresh look at the content.

#### **Future Membership Meetings:**

Recently the board has developed an outline for future Membership Meetings.

The new guidelines are to alternate meeting agendas as follows, which would be on a three-month cycle.

Month one – The agenda for inhouse membership meetings, most likely at the Kalamazoo Bridge Club, will include a short business meeting followed by an in-house or video clinic. These sessions will also include a Zoom link for those members that are unable to attend in-person.

Month two— Layout tours which could be out-of-town. Most likely for layout tour or Operating sessions, there will be no business meeting, unless there is something of importance to discuss with the members present. Most likely there will <u>not</u> be a zoom link available for out-of-town layout tours.

Month three - Layout tours of local layouts. Again, there will not be a business meeting unless there is something of importance to discuss and no zoom link available.

After the third month, the rotation starts over. Months two & three could be in reverse order if it makes more sense.

The main reason for separating in-house business meetings and local layout tours into separate sessions, is to hopefully increase participation in local layout tours. In the past, visits to local layout tours after an in-house membership meeting were not as well attended as we had hoped.

## **Lumber Company**

Interested in adding a lumber yard to your train layout? Here are some pictures and tips from Rich Mahaney on his recent visit to lumber yard in Zeeland.

Here is a couple of photos of a lumber company in Zeeland, MI that receives new lumber by railroad flat car. for modeling you would need offices and storage of lumber (both inside/covered storage and outside storage in the yard area). Walthers would have kits to help build a facility like this for your layout.









## **West Michigan Railroad Update:**

The West Michigan Railroad/Hamilton Northwestern Railroad is expanding services in Fillmore, MI (just south of Holland and east of M40) with a new "transloading" facility along their railroad tracks between Holland and Hamilton.

They can load and unload railroad cars at this location. They are looking for customers. See the photos.

This is like their facilities and work east of Hartford, MI.

This could easily be built on a spot on your model railroad and would add a new industry for you to service. Best thing is that it could take many different kinds of railroad cars depending on what is being brought in or transported out. That would be up to your imagination (and your business marketing skills).

# **Tool For Weathering Wood – Furniture Marker**

I decided to try this marker for giving strip wood and dimensional scale lumber that old, weathered look where the wood turns gray.

It works pretty well. It's easy to apply and dries quickly. Fine grain wood may need two applications.

# **Weathering Tool: Distress Oxide Pad**

This is something new (to me) that I've started to use in my weathering efforts.

It is an ink pad saturated with rust oxide ink. I use a brush to absorb the ink and apply it where needed.

It dries almost immediately.

#### Alan's Adventures in Model Railroading Volume 4

Since the last report, I have spent more time working on my layout and having a lot of fun in the process. Much of that time was spent on scenery projects. The farm area was covered with real dirt, a cow pasture, pig pen, corn and wheat fields were added along with a gravel road. Remaining tasks on the farm project include,

installing fences around the cow pasture and pig pen, adding a small pond, finishing the ground cover and adding other small details.

My next project was to begin work on a housing development. This included adding seven structures, two retaining walls, ground cover, sidewalks, roads, a small circular park, and some trees. Next steps will be to add more ground cover, some plants & trees and at least two scratch-built privacy fences, along with other details.



My final current project was building a commercial section which includes a gas station, Walther's Merchants Row I & II, a few other buildings a passenger depot and a freight depot. The structures are in-place, and an asphalt road added. The road needs to be finished, ground cover added along with plantings and other small details.

It is my hope to finish these three areas by the end of October?

Thank you to Leah Milowe and everyone associated with the Vicksburg Train Depot for allowing us to use their facilities for our annual meeting.
